
The Power of God at Work! The story of Steve Nichols

I have been at St. Paul for nearly a year now and God is doing amazing things in my life. I grew up as a Methodist Christian and went to church on a regular basis. I was very close to my grandmother until, when I was 7, she was killed in a tornado. That was a difficult time for me. I loved her and didn't understand why God would take her from me. I became angry with God and didn't really have any use for Him or for His church. It wasn't long before I was doing things that would lead me into big trouble. I started drinking when I was 10 and, at age 13, I began using drugs. In a period of just a few years, I lost 3 good friends to death and my anger and frustration toward God continued to grow. When I got out of high school, I entered the military but my drug and alcohol use led to a dishonorable discharge. I was feeling lost and very unloved and I began looking for love in all the wrong places. I met my ex-wife, who I married not because I loved her but because I wanted someone to love me. She was an alcoholic and I continued using drugs and, not long into our relationship, my drug addiction led me to prison for 17 years. I had hit the low point of my life. While I was in jail, I met Carl Marsh, a guy who loved Jesus inside the walls of a jail cell. He began to tell me how good Jesus was and what He could do for me if I'd just trust Him. I had been angry with God for so long that I had never taken the time to think about what He HAS done for me....I'm still alive....I still have my health....I'm still able to work.....and I began praying and seeking Him again. I felt convicted of some of my past sins and mistakes and made a commitment to Him that I was going to change my life with His help. In prison, God opened the door for me to go to college at Columbus State. I finished third in my class and graduated as a dental lab technician. I made false teeth and partials for seven years. When I finally got out of prison, I was living on the streets under a bridge. I heard about Good Shepherd Ministries and applied to live there and when I got accepted, I was told I had to find a church. Since I had grown up Methodist and lived close, I walked to St. Paul one day to worship and I've gone there ever since. I have felt love and acceptance from the people ever since I walked in the door. I have been given a second chance by God by my friends and family at St. Paul through opportunities to serve and to give back. I love St. Paul and the family I have at this church. But most of all, I love God and thank Him for everything He has done for me! Without Him, it's all downhill....for me....and for you! Thanks to Him, the joy of the Lord is my strength. Praise Him! ~as told to Pastor Jeff Cartwright


