Dear Friends of St. Paul,

A paradigm is a way of thinking about something. When applied to the church, the best description of the church-paradigm is to ask the question, "How do you invite someone to come to your church?" Do you tell them about all the wonderful programs and ministries and music and bible studies and social groups for all ages, where they can make friends (certainly all valid reasons to check us out)? Or do you invite them to come to where our creator is changing lives and making followers of Jesus?

When I was pastor and leading a new members' class, I would always ask, "What has brought you to our church?" And the most common answers had to do with the youth and children's programs and the music, and quite often just that we were of the right age and professional/culture set where I feel at home. Then I would suggest, "look around our church and explore, 'what's missing,' and then consider whether that is what the Lord is calling you here to fulfill?

You see, on the one hand the church-paradigm is not that much different than that of the YMCA or the rec. center or a lodge or service club, but on the other hand, we are a people called together by our Lord and called to follow His lead (certainly a much more difficult sell).

At St. Paul we call ourselves <u>A Place to meet the Lord</u> (read Matthew 25: 34-40). <u>Will you come and join us</u>? This newsletter will offer many opportunities to engage in the Lord's work here, or just come down and check us out and see what's missing. And I must say that often the most unseen thing that is missing is your financial gift that makes all the things you see possible.


