They were given housing at Christ UMC, Kettering and their cook was able to use the kitchen facilities. Each day [Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday] a different group of approximately 12 kids arrived at 9:00am eager to serve. They had so much energy and enthusiasm that it was hard to keep them busy! A great deal of work was accomplished:

- Carried and spread 7 yards of playground mulch
- Made an Aldi's run to stock up the food pantry
- Weeded all the flower beds
- Cleaned a large children's room downstairs and prepared the floor for waxing
- Staffed the Tuesday Lunch under Joyce Kennedy's supervision
- Stocked and cashiered in the Stuff Shoppe
- Unloaded and spread 80 bags of mulch at the Huffman Neighborhood's Jamison Garden at the corner of Ringgold and E. Fourth St.

This is just a list for St. Paul UMC!

They worked equally hard at several other places. For fun, the mission group had a day at King's Island plus a Reds/Braves ballgame.

It was really hard to say thank-you enough and also to say goodbye. St. Paul has been so blessed by this wonderful example of connectionism in the United Methodist Church.

A STORY OF LOVE AND COMMITMENT




years, a group from Hope Collective has served a delicious homemade breakfast the first Saturday of every month at St. Paul.

BACK TO SCHOOL NEEDS LIST

The first day of school is fast approaching! Thanks to generous donors, each year, St. Paul is able to distribute school supplies to approximately 40 needy children in our community. This year, we would like to distribute the supplies on Thursday, August 10, as most schools start the following week.

Items needed: Book bags, #2 pencil packs, packs of 12 crayons, boxes of tissues (2 boxes per student), paper towels (1 pack per student), glue sticks, large erasers, dry erase markers, pack of 12 washable markers, blunt scissors, plastic 2-pocket folders, pronged (multiple colors, up to 10 per student), composition notebooks (wide ruled and college ruled), headphones (NOT bluetooth), disinfecting wipes (1 pack per student), ziplock bags (gallon, quart and sandwich size), pencil boxes or bags, liquid hand sanitizer, three-ring binders, notebook paper (wide ruled and college ruled - 2 packs per student), pencil sharpeners, highlighters (3 colors), black or blue pens, spiral notebooks, index cards (1 pack per student), packs of 5 dividers, combination padlocks for high school students, flash drives.

THE WEST OHIO CAMPING MINISTRY

St. Paul UMC has been an active part of our conference's church camp ministry for many years. For several years, St. Paul sent the most children & youth from any one congregation to Camp Wesley. This was possible because of generous contributions from Miami Valley District United Women in Faith, other groups and individuals.

But of course, the COVID years changed everything. As our culture was changing, so must the camps. There seemed to be insurmountable challenges around staffing and property upkeep. Last year, we had children signed up for camp but it was cancelled at the last minute. This year, all camping was cancelled before we had anyone registered.

It was expected that a resolution would be introduced at 2023 Annual Conference [held in Dayton] to sell Camp Widewater & Camp Asbury but retain Camp Wesley in Bellefontaine. This motion was tabled to make way for further study.

Many of you are aware that the Miami Valley District United Women in Faith's Community Care account has a sizeable balance designated for camperships. For the time being, this will be held for the designated purpose. Keep in mind that there are currently a great many changes in the United Methodist Church at the district, conference, and national levels. Let's covenant to be in prayer as we move into our new future together.
