2021 TAX ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

St. Paul UMC completed another very successful Tax Program in April, 2022. Our three dedicated volunteers, Mike Cornelius, Kirby Lupton, and Arthur Mills, Jr. processed 181 Federal returns and 157 State returns. The total federal refunds for our folks this year was \$241,359, with an average of \$1333.48. The total state refunds for our folks this year was \$31,211, with an average of \$198.80. Because of the hard volunteer work of our 3 experienced preparers, we experienced a 17% increase in the number of returns as well as a 26% increase in the refund amounts. This program is a real blessing for low income workers.



West Ohio Conference Camp Wesley

Plans are under way to provide wonderful camping experiences for 12 – 14 St. Paul children and youth. This year the kids will be going to Camp Wesley July 13 – 15. Partnerships with the families, St. Paul UMC, St. Paul United Women in Faith, Miami Valley District United Women in Faith, and West Ohio Conference makes this venture possible. 4-7 yrs. will meet Fridays, July 1-22, 10-11:30am, lead by Vicki Morris.


8-12 yrs. will meet the week of July 25-29, 10-11:30am, lead by Beth Vanoli.
