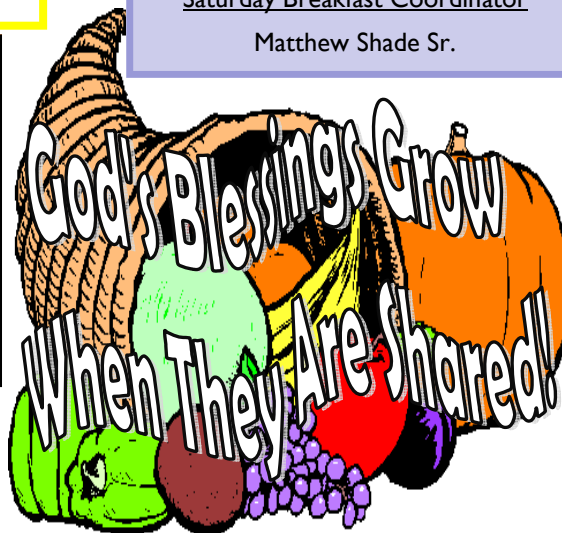

- ⇒ **Dayton Metro Library serves 450,000 people in 23 communities.** We use the library 10,000 times a day and borrow 3.6 million items a year. Attendance at children's reading programs and other library events exceeds 200,000.
- ⇒ **Many of our libraries are too small for needed books, computers and programs.** Old, inefficient, costly-to-maintain libraries drain dollars from books, technology and services. This could force buildings to close, sending children and residents to crowded other branches.

United Methodist Student Day

Meredith Leigh Paul is eager to help developmentally challenged children find their voice and communicate with others. She wants to give them what she has received from the United Methodist Student Day offering: the gift of hope.

"I want to work with children with special needs as a speech pathologist; that's what is on my heart," says the 20-year-old college student from Raleigh, N.C. She is a recipient of the Rev. Dr. Karen Layman Gift of Hope Scholarship, funded by the churchwide special offering.

The scholarship aids United Methodist students at accredited colleges who have shown leadership in their church. Indeed, they become gifts of hope for a denomination in dire need of more young leaders to chart its course into the future.

Paul studies speech pathology at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. When she was 15, she began helping children with special needs, working after school and during summers in local parks and recreation programs.

"I learned patience and endurance, how to encourage them and recognize progress," she recalls. "The longer you work with these children, the stronger the emotional bond you build, and communication is a huge part of it."

Paul has been a youth leader at Windborne United Methodist Church in Raleigh for several years. She says she feels "blessed and grateful" for her scholarship, especially when many other students have had to surrender their academic dreams because of rising costs and shrinking financial aid.

"It's nice to know your church is there for you. It strengthens my faith."

Be An Organ and Tissue Donor

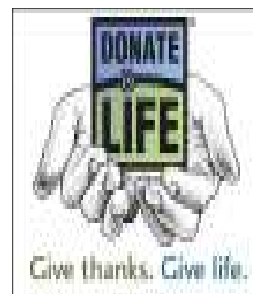
The United Methodist Church issued a policy statement regarding organ and tissue donation. In it, they state that, "The United Methodist Church recognizes the life-giving benefits of organ and tissue donation, and thereby encourages all Christians to become organ and tissue donors by signing and carrying cards or driver licenses, attesting to their commitment of such organs upon their death, to those in need, as a part of their ministry to others in the name of Christ, who gave his life that we might have life in its fullness." A 1992 resolution states, "Donation is to be encouraged, assuming appropriate safeguards against hastening death and determination of death by reliable criteria." The resolution further states, "Pastoral-care persons should be willing to explore these options as a normal part of conversation with patients and their families."

In Ohio, when you get a driver's license, permit or state ID at the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV), you'll be asked if you want to be an organ, eye and tissue donor.

Here are a few statistics:

- ♦ 110,000 Americans need an organ transplant.
- ♦ 3,400 Ohioans need an organ transplant.
- ♦ 18 Americans die each day waiting for an organ transplant.
- ♦ 2,000 Ohioans died while waiting for an organ transplant in the last 10 years.
- ♦ 2,000 Ohioans have their eyesight restored through cornea transplants every year.
