Hispanic-Latino Ministry at St. Paul UMC


What a full summer it has been for our Hispanic-Latino Ministry! In addition to our Christian formation programs – Spanish Worship and Las Amigas – a second series of Diabetes Education classes in Spanish as well as a second Immigration Forum were held at St. Paul.

Twelve families attended the June Immigration Forum, and were individually counseled by licensed attorneys from the legal aid firm ABLE.

Thirteen people are currently attending Diabetes classes, offered in conjunction with Public Health of Dayton and Montgomery County. On August 24, the last day of class, a mobil medical unit will offer free A1C tests to participants. At the same time, they will test for other diseases such as HIV. Counselors and interpreters will be available to advise individuals who test positive for diabetes or other diseases. This event is free and open to the public.

Susan taught the basic Lay Servant Ministry class for the first time in Spanish on July 14-15 at First UMC in Middletown. The hospitality at Middletown was over-the-top, and we are grateful to everyone who made the training possible. Thirteen Hispanic-Latino students from Middletown, Mason and St. Paul Dayton actively engaged in

Beth Wiley, YPC Director, will be interviewing Work/Study students from the University of Dayton for positions as YPC program assistants. The Work/ Study students will be introduced in the next newsletter. The Big Brothers/ Big Sisters organization has been working with us during the summer and will be assigning a big brother/big sister for each of our students. The emphasis of homework assistance continues to be critical for our children. Many of our children only do homework when they are at YPC. Some of our Hispanic parents are not able to help their children with homework in English.
