St. Paul United Methodist Church 2017

- 1. The Young Peacemakers' Club after school program hosted a family dinner in November before their Thanksgiving break. The children served their families and were assisted by staff and U.D. students. Each family received a turkey courtesy of the Key Club at Alter High School.
- 2. During the school year, the Young Peacemakers' Club receives a lot of attention from the Big Brothers/Big Sisters organization at the University of Dayton. In addition to individual attention with homework, there were special treats and field trips.
- 3. In April we celebrated Native American Ministries Sunday by signing a petition in support of Native American rights to send to Rep. Mike Turner.
- 4. Germantown United Methodist Church blesses us every July 4th week Tuesday Lunch with a wonderfully delicious picnic complete with several kinds of grilled meat and homemade ice cream! It is wonderful to be the recipients of so much love!
- 5. A nutritious hot breakfast is served every Saturday at St. Paul. Our guests experience a short devotional in the sanctuary, a sturdy breakfast and time to socialize.
- 6. The St. Paul Food Pantry is open for our community on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. Our pantry clients are able to choose food items provided by the Foodbank, individuals and groups that best suit their needs. Clients are interviewed by staff person, Cora Crain, and served by volunteers Ralph Daniels, Joyce Kennedy, Dan Vanoli, Linda Seals, Laurel Kerr, and Kath Fader.
- 7-9. The little wayward sheep kept the shepherds busy on their way to the manger. Meanwhile, the "Star of Bethlehem" comforted a fussy "Baby Jesus." More than 80 people from various Latin American countries celebrated our Savior's birth at Saint Paul UMC Dayton's annual Las Posadas celebration, held on December 16, 2017.
- Twice a year, St. Paul has a Steak Dinner fundraiser. This is a popular event complete with great volunteer service and beautiful music. St. Paul receives strong support from many area churches and donors. The next Steak Dinner will be Saturday, March 3, 2018!
- 11-12. One of the highlights of the Advent Season is Breakfast with Santa provided by Normandy United Methodist Church. The families are treated to a delicious breakfast; after singing Jingle Bells loudly several times, Santa miraculously finds his way to St. Paul to deliver gifts; each family of children has their picture taken with Santa.
- 13-14. Our community was devastated by the Food for Less fire which took the only grocery store in our neighborhood within walking distance for folks. In addition to food, pharmacy, and the ability to pay bills, there was a Turkish bakery and Hispanic specialties. We reached out to their owner and employees the week before Christmas by serving them a delicious meal and providing space for them to meet and plan for the future.
- 15. Our own Michael Garison, a gifted musician, gathered a group of his friends, including a harpist, guitarist, and percussionist, to hold Christmas caroling during Advent.
- 16-17. We celebrated the culmination of our waiting for Jesus on Christmas Eve with a beautiful Candlelight Service.
- ***[Not pictured] We ended 2017 by joining St. Paul Lutheran Church on Wayne Ave. for their final service on Sunday, December 31. It was a bittersweet experience as they closed their doors after 165 years of service and chose St. Paul UMC and 12 other nonprofits to carry on their legacy.
