Christmas Message

Well. Christmas season is upon us. And so begins the annual pursuit of finding the perfect gift for each of our loved ones. When I was a young parent, I remembered that desperate scramble to buy the hottest children's gift before it was sold out. Do you remember the Atari's Pong video game or the original Nintendo? How about Cabbage Patch Kids or Beanie Babies? Silly, wasn't it? How we are a slave to our consumerist society: first, the children, by being sold on the latest craze; and second, the parents, by the fear of being rejected by our children or grandchildren because we did not brave the struggle to get them what they really wanted! Yet I must admit that a certain satisfaction swells inside of every gift-giver when they see the joy beam from the face of their loved one opening a gift they truly wanted or, better yet, least expected. And that last phrase – "a gift truly wanted and least expected" – is the very essence of what happened on that first Christmas long ago.

Now I happen to believe that from the very beginning, God the Father planned to send His Son, Christ Jesus, into our world. It was Plan A all along, not Plan B. Indeed, we got the perfect gift that first Christmas!

Now I want to thank you all from the bottom of my heart during this Christmas season; and from all of us at St. Paul, we wish you blessings and joy to you and your loved ones. We coud not have been the hands and feet of Christ in our urban neighborhood for all these years without your selfless support in money, food and clothing donations, and in-person volunteering.
