Dream Sabbath Revisited

The Youth and the United Methodist Women of St. Paul U.M.C. sponsored a Dream Sabbath one year ago. In this deeply spiritual service, we prayed, sang and gave witness to the horrific stories of teen age immigrants and their dangerous journeys to the USA. Many came as young children and are now nearing high school graduation.

One year later, the Dream Act has not become a reality but progress has been made in assuring a future for many young people.

What is Deferred Action?

On June 15, 2012, Secretary of Homeland Security, Janet Napolitano, announced that certain people who came to the U.S. as children and meet several guidelines may request consideration of deferred action for a period of two years, subject to renewal, and would then be eligible for work authorization. Individuals who receive deferred action will not be placed into removal proceedings or removed from the U.S. The Department of Homeland Security can terminate or renew deferred action at any time at the agency's discretion. Deferred action is not a permanent status or pathway to citizenship. Individuals who meet the following qualifications may seek Deferred Action:

- Arrived in U.S. before the age of 16.
- Have continuously resided in U.S. from June 15, 2007 until present time.
- Were physically present in the U.S. on June 15, 2012.
- Are currently in school, have graduated form high school, have obtained a GED certificate or is an honorably discharged veteran of the Coast Guard or U.S. Armed Forces.
- Have not been convicted of a felony or significant misdemeanor.
- Do not pose a threat to public safety or national security.
- Were under the age of 31 on June 15, 2012.

Beginning August 15, 2012 applications, with a fee of \$465, can be submitted for consideration to the U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Services for Deferred Action & employment authorization.

There are individuals & organizations offering legal assistance. Only a licensed lawyer or accredited represented is authorized & qualified to assist with immigration cases. Please be aware of immigration scams! Please call the free appointment with Jack Grayer, attorney.



"I want to be a pastor with a global focus and also pursue opportunities to serve in missions and advocacy within The United Methodist Church." 2 Corinthians 9:7 Each of you must make up your own mind about how much to give. But don't feel sorry that you must give and don't feel that you are forced to give. God loves people who love to give.

In 1975, 6-year-old Julie Fleurinor and her family fled Haiti for Miami, along with thousands of other refugees escaping oppression and poverty. Today, thanks to a World Communion Scholarship, she dreams of returning home someday to bring healing and hope to her beloved but beleaguered native land.

Remarkably, Fleurinor is earning two master's degrees: one in divinity from United Methodist-related Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, III., and one in social work from Loyola University in Chicago.

She plans to use her training to provide holistic ministry—spiritual and social—to struggling communities in both the United States and Haiti.

"I want to be a pastor with a global focus on missions and advocacy," says Fleurinor, now a member of the Northern Illinois Annual Conference. She is passionate about helping Haitian-American immigrants and supporting Haiti's recovery from its devastating 2010 earthquake that claimed 300,000 lives.

Fleurinor says the World Communion Scholarship is a blessing for which she prayed fervently because of the high cost of seminary education. "I'm really thankful for it."
