We serve people every day who are on the edge of giving up, whose problems and backgrounds put them at great risk and whose troubles are multiple and complex. Then add to this the COVID-19 epidemic, a global threat, and you might well think we would tank. But we know that trouble produces endurance, endurance produces character and character produces hope. When everyone was shutting down, we were encouraged by our partnership with Dayton Public Health to stay open. The at-risk people we serve needed to have a place to connect with for housing, Medicaid sign up, counseling, food, and clothing. We have served as an anchor through all these months while consistently practicing and modeling safety measures.

Because we are small (but with big hearts and a strong sense of responsibility) we have been able, through our partnerships,



to restructure. We are adaptable and innovative. These days, like many days in the past reveal that we can care and reach far beyond what we have even historically done.

Sometime our greatest barriers have been our own thinking. The pandemic made us rethink and quickly learn that in the 21st century we need to be online and make distance worship and study available to our friends and members. Through the growing St. Paul Academy spiritual and social justice practices are available far beyond the walls of St Paul. With the addition of a new AmeriCorps Vista worker, St. Paul is providing tutoring two days a week for Dayton Public children whose only option is online learning. Elementary children are being tutored by UD students who can do work-study hours at no cost to the church and are providing valuable one-on-one time with the children. Parents are relieved.

Everything we do today is the fruit of deep, connected relationships and shared goals with you, our broader community. You have been essential in the ministry here in East Dayton. With Great Thanksgiving in 2020 we celebrate the unity, generosity, ingenuity, and endurance of the people of God. Together we Press On.
