### The Birch Tree

I think the birch tree in my front yard observes the Lenten season better than I do. Right now the snow is falling clinging to the tree's bare limbs as it stands amid a blanket of snow in silent surrender to a whistling winter wind. The tree appears dead, but it is only dormant as it prepares deep in its roots for the coming of spring. Then God's warm sunlight will awaken this plant; and its leaves and tiny white flowers will burst forth in a fancy spring dress; bees will feast on its flowers, robins will nest in its boughs, and squirrels will swing from its limbs. And the buzzing of the insects and the chirping of the birds will play a song of spring that will make this birch tree dance while standing still.

Isn't this what Lent is all about? As we celebrate the events of Jesus' life on this earth, should we not immerse ourselves in the ebb and flow of how he experienced this life? From the asceticism of his 40 days in the desert to his triumphal entrance into Jerusalem, from the absolute despair of his Crucifixion to the amazement and joy of the

Resurrection, should we not walk in his every step and experience these events in our hearts? Half of Christianity reveres the crucifix while the other half the empty, resurrected cross; yet it is only together that they tell the whole story of following the One who proclaimed himself, "The Way." Lent is a time to refocus ourselves on our journey – to re-evaluate what is really important in our lives. We are all members of the Body of Christ, and we would be naïve not to think that the Passion of Christ is still an ongoing trail of suffering in today's world. Some of us are actively suffering right now and need help and prayers to survive, and others are being called by God to provide whatever they can to those in need.

Jesus left us with the toughest challenge of all. He asked us to love one another as I have loved you! Both John Wesley and St. Francis of Assisi agreed that the best way to accomplish this command is by



getting close to the disadvantaged. This is why I serve and will continue to serve at St. Paul United Methodist Church. I readily admit I cannot see Jesus, but I certainly see those whom Jesus champions and calls "His little ones!"

The older I get the more I have come to realize that the more you participate in the "Passion" of Jesus, the more you experience the joy of Christ's Resurrection. By "Passion" I mean not just the sadness and suffering that reality deals each one of us, but I also mean Jesus' enthusiasm for us working together to help and comfort each other and heal the wounds on the Body of Christ. Simply put, we cannot get to the Resurrection without going through the cross. On this Easter Sunday may the preparations we made deep in the roots of our souls during Lent explode into acts of charity that leave our hands and feet dancing for joy in unison with all the other members of the Body of Christ! I know for sure that the birch tree in my front yard will be joining in the dance!

Hallelujah! He has risen!
