St. Paul is in need of some tender loving care. Our building has been a beacon in the Huffman neighborhood for over 135 years. At present, there is a leaking roof over the fellowship hall and subsequent interior damage. This repair requires a financial commitment that cannot be provided by our annual budget.

We currently have a bid of \$15,000.00 to replace 300 roofing slates. Interior damage repair, exterior tuck pointing and painting, and new lighting in the fellowship hall will add another \$35,000.00 for a total of \$50,000.00 needed. The roof repair is our most critical need and will begin immediately.

BREAKING THE PRISON CYCLE

HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS Each September, a new group of Horizon participants move into a dormitory where they live until graduation in the spring. The group is divided into family units of 6-8 participants with various backgrounds. By living as a family unit, participants learn how to live with others peacefully, a skill that will serve them the rest of their lives. Inmates in the program continue performing their regular work duties and adhering to the prison schedule. In the evenings, they return to the dormitory to study Horizon courses that explore spiritual development, character reformation, victim awareness, and trauma recovery.

In the spring, Horizon participants graduate from the program. They move out of the dormitory and back into the general prison population. This is where the ripple effect takes place. Our graduates share their newfound sense of value and dignity with other prisoners. They respect people who are different. They use anger management and conflict resolution to deal with issues that arise. The result is a safer prison for the people who live and work there. That is what we mean when we say that Horizon Prison Initiative transforms prisoners who then transform prisons.

IMPACT

- The cost to send a participant through our program is \$1,600.
- In 2015, the state prison population surpassed 50,000.
- In Ohio, the typical inmate has a 27% chance of returning to prison within three years of being released.
- Horizon lowers that rate to just 9%.
- For every 10 Horizon graduates who stay out of prison, the state saves \$260,000 per year.
- After being released from prison, most of our graduates become and stay gainfully employed, which reduces the need for government assistance for food and shelter Horizon's mission is to transform prisoners who transform prisons and communities.

ESOL at St. Paul and LEC: a fruitful partnership

As part of its outreach to immigrants in the neighborhood, the Hispanic-Latino Ministry at St. Paul UMC offers English as a Second or Other Language (ESOL) classes.

Last year St. Paul formed a partnership with the Life Enrichment Center (LEC), which is located a few blocks away from the church. The partnership will continue this year.

A flyer in Spanish was hung on bulletin boards in area businesses, and a Facebook invitation/ad targeting our specific market was posted. We expect a good turnout for the classes.

Evening classes at LEC will begin on September 6 on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 6:30–8:30 p.m. Morning classes are held at St. Paul on Wednesdays from 10 a.m.-12 p.m.

We are blessed to welcome two highly skilled servant leaders to the program:

Sue Strahan is a retired ESOL teacher from Columbus City Schools. Sue brings with her a wealth of experience, having worked extensively with Somali immigrants in Columbus. Sue lives in West Carrollton and attends Germantown UMC.

Derek Petrey, Director, Center for Teaching and Learning at Sinclair Community College, studied Latin American Cultures and Literature at The Ohio State University. Derek has traveled widely in Latin America and Europe, and is fluent in Spanish and Portuguese. Derek attends St. Paul UMC.

Sue and Derek will report monthly attendance and student progress to Susan Whigham, Director of the Hispanic-Latino Ministry at St. Paul.


At a glimpse
