"The Action of Loving"

I always prefer a win-win relationship, where all parties benefit from an interaction. John 3:16-17 describes a win-win relationship, "16 For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. 17 God did not send his son into the world to condemn it, but to save it."

Wow talk about winning! We get eternal life, not condemned by God but saved by God. The other side of this equation is God receives the "action of loving". Does this really make a balanced equation?

(ACTION OF LOVING = ETERNAL LIFE & SALVATION)

PEACE WITH JUSTICE

SUNDAY, JUNE 15, 2014

To Strengthen a Fragile PEACE

As he fled North Korea in 1963, the Rev. Syngman Rhee, then 19, heard his mother's last words to him, "Wherever you go and whatever you may face, remember to pray to God, and we will see each others in out prayers."

Rhee was a keynote speaker at the Ecumenical Korea Peace Conference in May 2013 in Atlanta. United Methodist Bishop Hee-Soo Jung of the Wisconsin Annual Conference chaired the event. More that 130 participants represented 10 denominations. A Peace with



Justice grant from the General Board of Church and Society helped fund the conference. A foundational understanding was that the Korean War Armistice of 1953 did not end the war. Without a peace treaty, the United States and North Korea continue to be technically in a state of war.

"Hundreds of thousands of families are divided by the demilitarized zone," Jung said, "and experience the violation of the basic human rights to live in peace as family." Participants recalled pain-filled stories of family separation. During the opening worship service, they planted seeds in flower boxes on the altar and poured communion water from North and South Korea on them. The Communion bread was made and white flour from South Korea.

"God's justice and peace," Jung said "needs to be done ... wherever people live under the threat of war. "Those before us lay the path for us to be peacemakers" he added. "God's grace is with us and God has helped us plant this seed for the future."

Peace with Justice Sunday, traditionally celebrated on the first Sunday after Pentecost (June 15, 2014), witnesses to God's demand for a faithful, just, disarmed and secure world. The special offering empowers United Methodists to work for peace for God's children everywhere. Half of the offering supports Peace with Justice grants: the rest remains in each congregation's annual conference to support local Peace with Justice ministries. ~Barbara Dunlap-Berg

How does Peace with Justice Sunday advocate for peace and justice at home and around the world?

This offering allows The United Methodist Church to have a voice in advocating for peace and justice through a broad spectrum of global programs:

- The Ohio-based Faith Communities Uniting for Peace encourages Christians, Buddhists, Hindus, Jews, Muslims and Sikhs "to live from a vision of peace rooted in faith."
- In Liberia—in partnership with other religious and humanitarian groups. The United Methodist Church provides a place for former child soldiers to live, recreational activities to address war trauma, and basic necessities such as fresh drinking water and medical treatment.

Peace with Justice Sunday enables The United Methodist Church to witness to God's hope for a faithful, loving world. The offering awards grants to organizations who advocate for peace and equality. Please Give generously.
